Local Laws

Local Laws exist so that the community can lead a lifestyle that is not affected by nuisance animals. Dog and Cat owners need to be responsible pet owners so that their animals do not disturb, annoy or harm any other person. Substantial fines can be issued by Council as a last resort should dog/cat problems arise.

Registration

All dogs/cats over three months of age must be registered.

Registrations Fees

Registration Tags

Registered dogs and cats must wear a collar and their tag at all times. This allows Council to contact the owner should the dog be found straying.

Number of Animals

The number of dogs and cats permitted to be kept on any one (1) property within the defined town area is two (2). If you wish to have more than two (2) dogs or cats, you will need to apply for a permit from Council.

Walking your Dog

When walking your dog in a public place it must be on a leash. If your dog defecates in a public space you are required to remove the faeces and dispose in a sanitary way.

Straying Dogs and Cats

Dogs and cats should be confined to their own property at all times unless the dog is restrained on a leash and under the control of a capable person. It is a requirement of the Local Law for dog owners to maintain a suitable enclosure that prevents their dogs from straying.

Barking Dogs

Noisy dogs can be a problem for neighbours. Council requires owners to control their dogs to ensure that a nuisance cannot occur. Advice on how to control your dogs barking can be obtained from either your veterinarian or local Council.

Dangerous Dogs

Dangerous dogs need special control and supervision. Failure to properly undertake this responsibility can result in serious injury or death to people or animals. In extreme circumstances the dog may be removed and destroyed by Council. Council may choose to prosecute or the aggrieved party may take their own civil action. Proper precautions such as suitable fencing could be less expensive than a court battle.
